Pete's Go-to fly:

The Compara-Dun

Background:

How I became aware of this fly was whilst drifting on Little Pine Lagoon with Peter Hazel-wood. The subject of what flies to tie on during the day - before, during and after a hatch was discussed. He remembered one fly that he had had plenty of success with but could not get an exact copy remade having lost the original. He spoke glowingly of its success especially after the hatch had slightly subsided.

To prove its worth, he tied his copy on (not the original tie) and had little success during the hatch but made amends as the hatch waned by catching quite a few fish. This fly became his go-to fly on many summer days at Little Pine, Arthurs, Bronte and Penstock.

I was handed a copy of the fly and searched the shops to find one similar. Pete was right there are so many variations and none like the original. The flies are still successful but not as effective as the original tie.

This fly was designed by Al Caucci in the mid 1960's after modifying a fly called the 'haystack'. He refined the fly after many variations to imitate the mayfly dun that was present in the area.

Over the years the compara-dun lived up to all expectations and met all the criteria for dry-fly perfection. It is highly imitative, practically unsinkable, and extremely durable.

Al said it should be fished dead-drift directly in the feeding lane of the trout. It is also effective when both spinners and duns are present on the water at the same time.



The Tie:

Hook Light wire dry-fly hook.

Thread Prewaxed 6/0 nylon, colour to match body.

Body Rabbit fur dubbing.

Wing Fine deer hair (mask) to match wing of the natural.

Tails Stiff hackle fibres or mink tail guardhairs – tied split.

Process:

1. Insert hook and lay down a bed of thread to approx. the front fifth of the shank.

- 2. Cut a 1/8 inch clump of deer hair. Approx. as long as the hook shank.
- 3. Tie in deer hair with the tips facing forward over the hook eye.
- 4. Apply 4 5 sequentially tighter wraps to bind and flare the wing.
- 5. Clip deer hair buts on an angle.
- 6. Pull wing upright and tie a few wraps (at least 10) of thread in front of it to maintain the position.
- 7. Wind the thread over the clipped deer hair buts to make a smooth underbody.
- 8. Wind the thread to the hook bend.
- 9. Form a small bump with the fur dubbing to split the tail fibres.
- 10. Tie in the tail fibres and must form a "V" shape.
- 11. Apply fur dubbing to wing tie down area.
- 12. Dub the thorax area tightly to help keep the wing upright.
- 13. Whip finish and cement the head.

Note:

The split tails and 180 degree arc of the wing material are critical to achieving the proper float.

This fly has proved its success on all highland waters.

Some of this information and the tying process was taken from the book "Hatches II" by Al Caucci and Bob Nastasi.

Treasurer's Report:

Our Treasurer noted that it has been a very stressful time for both him and his wife recently with the news that our bank account has been compromised and some funds has been sucked out.

The bank was contacted immediately, and our members have been notified. Our existing

account is frozen so no monies can be withdrawn but money can still be deposited, and he cannot confirm what the current balance is.

We are now in the hands of the bank to gain a reimbursement and the Cyber police have been informed.

We have created a new account at the bank and those details will be revealed when that is opened it should take about a week.

We will keep you informed of the process.

Matters arising:

Chris noted that if the bank's first response is NO we should not accept it and pursue that further.

Phil noted that the Club should not send emails with the bank's details, as they are easily tracked. Verification should be only done by phone prior to sending or depositing monies.

Jimmy noted that STMA had over the last month 200 cyber attacks with 5 being specific hard-core ones that any ordinary person would not have known the difference.

John Morwood raised his items of concern that was included in his email for the committee to discuss.

Club Shacks:

Members are reminded that over the off-season period the shack rental for Koongara is half price.

Corralinn Fly Fishing & Casting Association:

The Chairman updated the members present that all FFCT members have now been notified of the proposed merger with the Corralinn club.

He noted that the FFCT did not need to create a special resolution because we are not changing, but we needed to inform our members so that they could have their say. An agreement between the two clubs has been drafted and will be presented to the Corralin members for acceptance. The Secretary thanked Jimmy, Corey and Phil for their input in the final agreement.

The procedure now is that Corralin will pass a special resolution to merge. The signed agreement with the FFCT will accompany that resolution to the Commissioner; whereby Corralinn will merge with the FFCT and Corralinn will be deregistered. Their proposed date will be the 30th June 2023.

We did have preliminary discussions at our last General meeting but now that we know what path we are taking, we could finalise this with the vote tonight.

Members thoughts & comments:

Gary noted that Corralinn will still be holding their casting days prior to the merger and our members are invited to join.

Mike noted that those members that did not elect to merge would have to go through our normal selection process. Those that did will still have to complete the forms, but fees will be waived.

The tangible assets that will be transferred from Corralinn would be enough to cover nay transfer fees.

A vote that our Club accept the merger with the Corralinn club was called and passed by a show of hands 26 for to 1 against.

AAT Webcams:

The Chariman noted that State funding to install and maintain the webcams has been dramatically reduced and AAT are having difficulty in gaining sponsorship.

It was agreed that the Club should seek clarification and action for the Government by writing to the minister.

Other General Business:

A knife was found at Penstock Lagoon – contact John Stagg if it is yours.

Fishing Reports:

Only Mike revealed that he went out on the close of the season and caught a fish on both his first and last cast. This was somewhere in a small local stream.

Club Raffles:
