# Winter Fly Fishing by Gavin Chugg

Normally I would leave fishing during the off-season and wait for the trout opening in August. However, with twin boys, Sam and Lachlan (always keen to fish), fishing is always 'on the cards' and can happen in any weather and at any time of year.

Lach, was keen to get a couple of trips in for practice before the opening proper of the trout season and in wintery June the chosen location for the sessions was Brushy Lagoon. We fished Brushy three times during June and July. On all three occasions my phone was receiving weather warnings of gale force winds and rain from the Deckee boating App, not ideal, and I did not need to look at my phone to know the weather was atrocious.

On all visits we caught good numbers of brown and rainbow trout, and a salmon, using streamer fly patterns. Sink tip, and type 5 sinking lines, in water depths of 4 to 7 metres, were used from our drifting boat. The best streamer flies were combinations of Shrek, Humongous, Magoo, and the Black and Chartreuse Streamer (photographed). Retrieve rates were generally slow, using distinct pauses, before bringing the flies up to the important 'hang'.

On opening day 2023, Lach and I, were on Four Springs Lake before sunrise. Our aim was to improve on our previous 'first morning' efforts, and to see if our practice sessions at Brushy had paid off. Using the methods we had practiced it did not take long before fish started coming to the net. Opening day of the 2023 trout season was our best to date.

I have included the materials that I have used to tie one of the streamers mentioned, the Black and Chartreuse streamer. I am, by no means, claiming to be the inventor of this fly. In fact, an internet search of streamer patterns shows many similar ties with various names.

#### Black and Chartreuse Streamer

Hook:- Hanak H230BL, size 10. Bead:- Hanak 2.8mm, chartreuse. Thread:- Black. Body:- Spectra Dubbing, Code 96. Rib:- Gold wire. Tail:- Black Marabou. Tail Flash:- Flashabou, pearl/olive Hackle: Black hen

# **Book Review**


# Tasmanian Mayflies (Identification, Ecology, Behaviour and Imitation)

# By Ron Thresher

The Fly Fishers' Club of Tasmania has been fortunate to receive a copy of this book from the CSIRO prior to its release in the bookshops.

The Author Ron Thresher has devoted 30 years of study on the behavioural ecology of aquatic insects. He is also an avid fly fisherman - when the time permits. It is from his angling background that he makes the information easy to read and understand. For those that are more scientifically minded he has included a chapter for 'further reading'.

The book (as the title says) covers the mayfly species in Tasmania (and SE Australia). It describes the identification of each type of mayfly from each of the four stages of their life



cycle. This is included with some detailed illustrations and magnificent photographs. It describes the important ecological role that the aquatic insects play in health of the waterways. And the behaviour of each stage below and above the water line.

A chapter is dedicated to reasons why there was a decline in the mayflies in Tasmania and how recent sampling has shown that it may be recovering, but with some species unfortunately not in certain areas.

The last 2 chapters have been provided as an important reference to fly fisherman. It lists where each mayfly will be encountered and what fly imitation had worked for the author.

This book is an important addition to an angler's library and a must for any fly fisherman this copy will be stored in the Club library.

It is published by the CSIRO Publishing and retails for \$59.99.


