I have been watching the level of Little Pine Lagoon; it has only risen about 30mm over the last week, and is now -1.28 below full. At the same time last year it was 0.8 below full. At the moment Lake Augusta is -2.93, last year it was -1.00.



Club Outing Christmas in Winter




Our annual event "Christmas in Winter" will be held at Noonamena soon.

Minutes of the General Meeting Held at Chant Street on Wednesday 4th of June 2025

MEETING OPENED: 7:30 pm.

President Martin Hingston welcomed the 27 members, 3 guests and guest speaker to the meeting. He recommended that all mobile devices be turned off or placed on to silent.

Guest Speaker:

The President re-introduced Garry (Hairy) Castles to the members. His topic tonight will be on cane rod building.

Garry, who lives in Miena began making cane rods in 2015 under the guidance of Nick Taransky at Peter Hayes's place near Cressy.

On display was the Tonkin cane bamboo culm and the split strips that were created using a knife and mallet. The process then was to remove any twists or bends in the strips by heating this also removes any moisture. Then placing the strips int a tapered form unit they are either sanded or planed to create the required taper. The strips are then glued and bound together to form a smooth, tapered blank. This is then cured prior to re-planning. The ferrules are attached and wrapped to the rod. The reel seat and cork grip are installed and shaped to suit. Multiple coats of varnish are applied to finish the rod. Garry estimated that it takes about 100 hours to make a rod.

Many questions were asked during the presentation and after it.

The President led the members in showing our appreciation to Garry for his remarkable presentation.

The Damsel Nymph



Background:

Damselflies are from the order *Odonata*, suborder *Zygoptera*. In Tasmania there are two common families, namely the *Lestidae* and the *Coenagrionidae*. The larvae of the former are slender and have 3, long, narrow caudal gills. The larvae of the latter are small and stocky with broader gills. The larvae use their gills for breathing and swimming.

Their colours of green / brown help them to camouflage whilst hunting for their prey and

hiding from predators. In either early morning or at night the larvae break from below the water to something above the water's surface. This is the best time for the angler as the larvae are very active and readily sought after by the trout.

The Tie

Hook Long shank #10, #12 Kamasan B830, or similar

Tail Olive marabou fibres (hook shank length)

Body Olive dubbing; possum or hare's ear

Ribbing Gold or silver flat tinsel

Wing case Slip of turkey wing

Eyes Bead chain - burnt mono or similar

Beard Olive marabou fibres



Process

- 1. Set the hook in the vice and lay down a bed of silk.
- 2. Tie in the eyes just back from the hook eye and seal with a drop of cement.
- 3. Take the thread to the bend and tie in the tail and the ribbing.
- 4. Wind on the body dubbing to just behind the eyes.
- 5. Wind the ribbing forward and tie off. Then tie in the wing case.
- 6. Add a little more body dubbing in figure eight fashion between the eyes, ending in front.
- 7. Pull the wing case over between the eyes and tie it down.
- 8. Rotate the vice or turn the hook upside down and tie in the beard.
- 9. Whip finish and end with a small, cemented head.

Note:

- 1. To add more weight to the fly you could substitute the ribbing with heavy wire.
- 2. Cast the fly in a weeded area and let the fly sink. Retrieve the fly with slow movements with long pauses and occasional lifts of the rod. Takes can be either gentle or the rod can be almost yanked out of your hand. A fast or slow sinking line is best adapted depending on the depth of water fished, season and water temperature.


