The Hare's Ear Nymph

Background:

The Hare's Ear Nymph (aka Gold Ribbed Hare's Ear) is a pattern that has stood the test of time. It is a fly that nobody knows how old it is nor who first tied it. It was initially thought of as a dry fly and later altered by Frederick Halford who popularized it as a nymph pattern in the 1880's.

There are probably two nymph patterns that would be readily recognised anywhere in the

world where fly fishermen chase trout. One is the pheasant tail nymph, and the other is the Hares Ear nymph.

Its name derives from the use of hare's ear dubbing, which imparts a buggy appearance to the pattern. It imitates a variety of aquatic life, including scuds, sow bugs, mayfly nymphs, stonefly nymph, and caddis larvae.

The Tie:

Hook Wet fly or 2x long nymph #10 - 16.

Tail Hares mask guard hairs.

Rib Gold wire or tinsel.

Body and Thorax Hares fur dubbing.

Wing Case Slip of turkey wing.

Process:

- 1. Set the hook in the vice.
- 2. Lay thread base from hook eye to just above the barb.
- 3. Tie in tail half shank length.
- 4. Tie in rib.
- 5. Dub thread and form the body to about 1/3 of the shank length back from hook eye.
- 6. Wind the rib forward 3 or 4 turns and tie off in the same place.
- 7. Tie in the wing case.
- 8. Apply more dubbing to the thread to form the thorax to just behind the hook eye.
- 9. Pull the wing case over the thorax and tie off. Trim off the excess.
- 10. Create a small head with the tying thread.
- 11. Whip finish.

Note:

- 1. Ensure that the wing case pointing back over the body.
- 2. Build the thorax to slightly larger than the body.
- 3. Variations to this tie include a bead head version and one with copper ribbing instead of the gold. It can also be tied using both lighter and darker fur from the same mask.
- 4. A rabbit mask makes a reasonable substitute.

This fly appeared in the "Fly of the Month" archive by and with thanks to Alan Taylor for the tying instructions of his fly.



Concerns in Four Springs Lake - Charles Peck

This was initially established as a recreational water with work and funds contributed from the angling community in its creation. So the decision to allow a commercial eel fishery was very unpopular particularly since what has previously happened in Lake Leake and Brushy Lagoon. To alleviate similar issues at Four Springs the IFS indicated that they would supply the elvers and ensure that the nets would be specific only to that water.

Recently a large redfin perch was captured here last season. I also believe that the present eel fisher stocks the elvers as well. So now there appears to be no control on where the elvers come from or whether the supply is contaminated with redfin perch. The large population of smelt that is now present here must have been transferred from elsewhere.

The decline in mayfly may also be attributed to the eels as I have witnessed them being eaten by eels elsewhere.
